What is it?

Sixty-six books that harmoniously speak about: God's plan of redemption through His Son Jesus Christ.

It contains the "Old Contract" (Law, History, Wisdom, Poetry, and Prophets) and the "New Contract" (The Gospel, Acts, Letters and Revelation). It is divided by Books, Chapters, and Verses.

Why is it important to read?

1. Spiritual Food

Matthew 4:4. But He answered and said, "It is written, 'MAN SHALL NOT LIVE BY BREAD ALONE, BUT BY EVERY WORD THAT PROCEEDS FROM THE MOUTH OF GOD.' "

2. Renew the mind

Romans 12:2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

3. Direction for life

Psalms 119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path.

4. Mirror

James 1:22 But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. 23 For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; 24 for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. 25 But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does.

5. To know who God is and what He does

Psalms 145:9 The LORD is good to all, And His tender mercies are over all His works.

Where to start:

- Two chapters a day starting in Matthew. (Read along with the teacher)
- Memory scriptures together.
- Pray and ask God to speak to you while you read.
- Write down questions.
